Environment Committee – Recycling Collection and Market Impacts

Feb. 18, 2020 10 AM to Noon Hosted by the City of Elmhurst Elmhurst City Hall, 209 N. York St., Elmhurst

It has been two years since China stopped allowing plastic waste to be imported into its country in what is known as the National Sword policy. This Environment Committee meeting will cover how this has affected the recycling market in the United States so far and what municipalities can expect in the future. Have waste haulers and municipalities been able to reduce contamination in order for recycling to become profitable? If not, will municipalities pay more in their contracts for recycling or even consider <u>canceling their recycling programs</u>? We will explore whether recycling markets are healthy enough to support municipal recycling, what municipalities can do to improve the situation, and innovative solutions that have emerged to address the problem.

Specifically:

- The Executive Directors of the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County (SWALCO) and the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) will discuss market issues and provide insight from negotiating dozens of municipal contracts, including what municipalities should look out for and best practices.
- In 2021, recycling plastic could become even more difficult with changing regulations, which a U.S. EPA expert will discuss. However, there are actions municipalities can take to address this problem.
- Lake County conducted a waste audit at five of its government buildings, as part of a greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions assessment. Two Greenest Region Corps Members will discuss the waste and recycling findings from this audit, as well as a <u>new cart tagging program SWALCO</u> <u>implemented</u> and whether it's effective at changing residents' recycling behavior.
- The <u>City of Elmhurst</u> offers a variety of recycling options and programs for residents. After hearing an overview of Elmhurst's recycling events and options, we invite you to share ideas and resources on what you are doing in your municipality, what has worked, and areas where you need more assistance.
