Air Pollution Control Act of 1955




• "An Act to provide research and technical assistance relating to air pollution control"

Federal Water Pollution Control Act of 1948




Clean Air Act Amendments



1967 Amendments The Air Quality Control Act




- Required the Designation of Air quality Regions and Allowed for the Development of Standards
- Beginning of the State Implementation Plan (SIP) Program









National Environmental Policy Act



- Passed in 1969 and signed in 1970
- NEPA requires federal government to assess environmental impacts of projects
- First major environmental law

 - Quality of life




- Actions that reduce greenhouse gas emissions can also have positive impacts on all of the above factors.
