





Why Residential Energy?



Energy Burden

- Energy burdens occur when energy costs exceed 6% of household income
- In Illinois, low-income families on average have a 13% energy burden
- There can be serious health and economic consequences facing lowincome households with large energy burdens



Approach

- 1. Research pathways municipalities use to serve target residents, especially low-income & senior. The same pathways could be used to deliver energy education.
- 2. Implement energy education and engagement through pathways to test effectiveness.
 - Need pilot communities.
 - Empower municipalities to reach target populations with energy information.
- 3. Innovate/integrate with regional climate plan, EV policy
