CENSUS 2020: When Do Counts Arrive?

TWO WAVES OF DATA:

Apportionment Data (Statewide, used to estimate Congressional seats)

- **Original Delivery Date:** December 31, 2020
- **Estimated New Date:** April 30, 2021

Redistricting Data (Local, used for redistricting, provides municipal estimates)

- **Original Delivery Date:** April 30, 2021
- **Estimated New Date:** July 31, 2021

Illinois state Constitution sets deadline of June 30 for state/federal redistricting. This does **NOT** apply to local governments.

CENSUS 2020: What My Town Has An Undercount?

THREE AVENUES

Count Question Resolution: Allows towns to challenge Census counts for population or housing units related to technical, data, or processing issues.

Populations Estimate Challenge Program: Allows challenges to improve interdecennial counts through the American Community Survey. Has not been as successful in 2010s.

Special Census: Enumeration at request of town, governmental unit is financially responsible for its cost.

CENSUS 2020: What Tools Will Be Available?

Census Quality Reinforcement Task Force: National task force, focused on:

- Ensuring the Bureau processes the data accurately;
- Determining whether there is an undercount;
- Recommending best practices (e.g., distribution of federal funds, ways for localities to challenge count).

The Chicago region does not have a similar program to determine whether there is an undercount or make recommendations to do something about it.

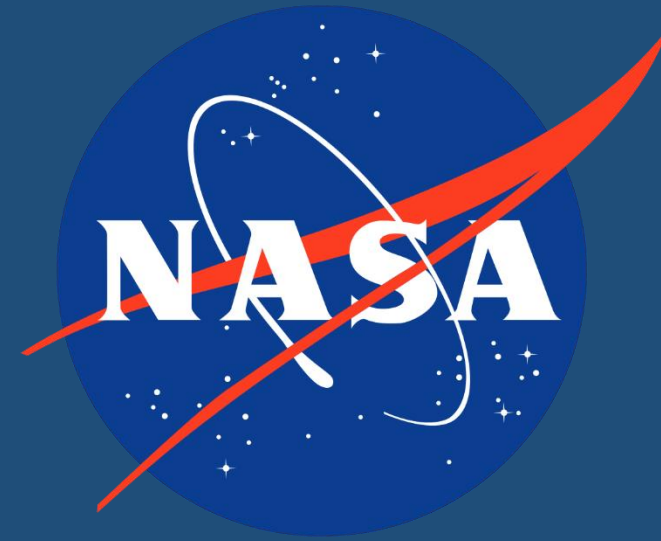

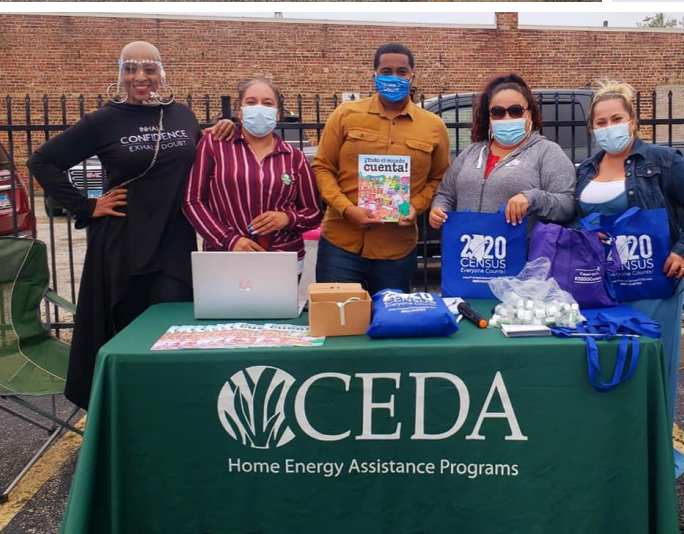

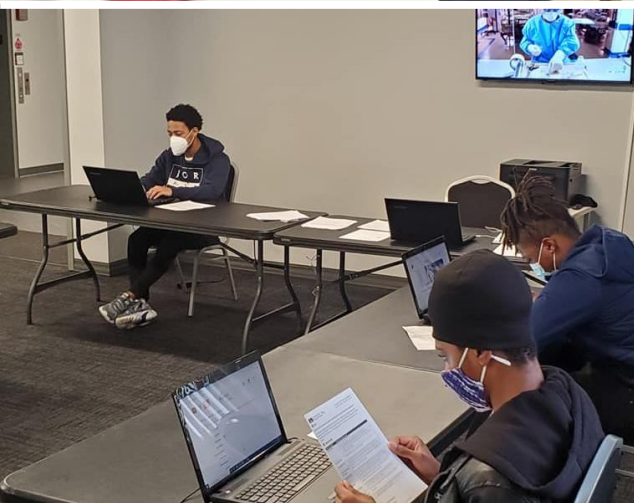
