- 2. Consumers and Climate First Act ("CCFA", SB 2896)
- 3. Clean Union Jobs Act ("CUJA", HB1472, SB 1100)

Legislative Landscape for Transportation Electrification

- 1. EV Act (20 ILCS 627 (2011))
- 2. VW Mitigation Beneficiary Mitigation Plan (IEPA)
- 3. IL Capital Bill (IL Public Act 101-29, Sec 25) for EV charging infrastructure

## Roles of Local Government: Readiness

- Facilitate deployment of EVs and EV Charging Infrastructure (EVCI):
  - Commit to EV Readiness
  - Plan for EVs and EVCI readiness
  - Develop and enforce EV and EVCI standards and codes for safety, health, zoning, permitting, certification, inspection, siting, parking, etc.
  - Set expectations for new and retrofit construction EV readiness
  - Engage with state & federal EV and EVCI programs
  - Work regionally to strategically site L2 and DCFC EV Charging Infrastructure
  - Establish baselines and metrics for tracking progress

## Roles of Local Government: Readiness

#### • Electrify transportation:

- Electrify municipal fleets, especially larger vehicles
- Advance use of E-transit and E-school buses
- Site EV charging stations w/in community
- Work with utilities on Beneficial Electrification and management of EV charging loads, demand profiles, and integrated solutions
- Support equitable access for Environmental Justice and low-income communities
- Train staff and facilitate EV education in the community

## Potential Roles of Local Government and Transportation Electrification:

- Administrative and participatory roles
  - Beneficial electrification, distributed integrated energy and grid optimization programs
  - Establishment of Clean Energy Empowerment Zones w/in community
- Participate in Community Energy, Climate, and Jobs Plans
  - Clean Energy Employment pilots and programs
  - EV Access for All programs EV sharing, carbon free last mile,
     ZEV procurement
  - Help public find ways to save money
  - Establish tax, revenue and incentive programs aligned within Clean Energy Empowerment Zone plans
  - Work with utilities
  - Leverage Energy Community Reinvestment Funds
- Manage rules proposed for EV Charging for new and retrofit construction
- Provide and/or facilitate education and outreach to communities

## Potential Roles of Local Government and Transportation Electrification:

- Focuses on amendments to EV Act and the EV Charging Act:
  - Clarifies and expands State administrative roles & responsibilities and initial EV and EVCS rebate programs, plus sets roles and responsibilities of utilities, including programs for EJ and low-income communities
- As a *Community Based Organization (CBO),* local governments can participate in *Community Energy and Climate Plans* which can provide ideas for transportation electrification and integration into distributed energy solutions
- Local governments need to manage CBOs and their Plans (applications, reviews, approvals)
- Local government is provided with (favorable) opportunities /methods for financing, bonds, taxation, investment and support for Clean Energy programs
- For transportation electrification, local governments can receive and manage grants R&D facilities and participate as Empowerment Zones to develop Illinois manufacturing sites for Clean Energy Jobs.

# Potential Roles of Local Government and Transportation Electrification:

(Amendment 1)

- Defines Beneficial Electrification Portfolio Standard (BEPS), Public Transportation Electrification Subsidy Program, Clean Energy Integrated Distribution and Utility Roles.
- Geared towards decarbonization and advancing the role of Transportation Electrification to reduce costs and improve environmental outcomes
- Local governments play key roles in advancing Beneficial Electrification programs
  - Local governments have clearly defined roles and responsibilities in CUJA
  - Rules on taxing, revenue and incentive programs aligned with Enterprise Zone plans
  - Work with utilities to install /operate EVCI, recover costs in reasonable time periods,
- Tools and funding to support negatively impacted communities
