

Reminder of Diversity Task Force Survey


- Sent to all Mayors & Managers in spring 2021

Top Areas of Interest from the Survey






Environmental Justice was the third most popular topic of interest in our survey

KEY CHALLENGES identified in survey



- Limited staffing, resources, and internal expertise to do this work

- Lack of unified, multijurisdictional collaboration on shared challenges
- Difficulties connecting, building trust, and engaging with a diversity of residents
