## KCHD Environmental Health Program Private Onsite Sewage Disposal & Private Well Programs

- In late November, 2019, the Kane County Health Department (KCHD) successfully achieved national reaccreditation through the Public Health Accreditation Board (PHAB), extending its accreditation status for another five years.
- KCHD follows IDPH Well Code section on closed loop wells and local ordinance.
- Over 60% of Kane County is served by private water wells.
- Numerous communities are considered "unsewered" meaning they do not have access to a public sewer system.



#### Current & Past Closed Loop Well Projects

 Currently in 2023 have one on going closed loop well project located at Dundee Middle School in West Dundee, IL

• In 2022, we issued two closed loop well permits. One permit was

for a church and another for a private residence.

- Serosun Farms Project
   unincorporated Hampshire:
  - Luxury community based on sustainable practices
  - Homes built with geothermal wells
  - Equestrian facilities and local farming on site





#### What is Kane County's Role in Geothermal?

- 1) Permit application process What is required in the submission review to KCHD?
- 2) KCHD review What are we looking for on the plan? Residential and commercial examples unincorporated vs. incorporated
- 3) Inspection visit and authority of the health department
- 4) What parts do we inspect? Post installation record requirements



#### Kane County Permitting Process

- Important to have complete permit application requirements.
- 1.) Fully filled out permit application.
- 2.) Site plan diagram showing all setbacks, borehole locations, existing wells, existing septic systems, public utilities, etc..
- 3.) Payment made to Kane County Health Department –we issue the permits.


Construct, Deepen or Modify Geothermal Wells (1st ten) \$100.00

Additional Geothermal Wells \$10.00 Each


Inspection Fee (Paid at time of permit fee) \$180.00

#### Kane County Authority

- We are the only agency in Kane County authorized to give the required Illinois Dept. of Public Health approval for a closed loop well system's construction, modification or sealing.
- During construction of the closed loop well we primarily communicate with the driller to schedule site inspections and timeframes.
- What we inspect at the site (not always all in one day or same day):
  - grouting
  - drilling materials in compliance
- Policy of health department is to inspect/visit every job site.



#### After the well is completed

- We provide an inspection report to the well driller.
- The licensed contractor is required to make an official drill log and submit it to KCHD.
- KCHD submits all paperwork to the Illinois State Water Survey after the well is completed (permit, inspection reports, drill log, site plan).
- Records are kept on file, KCHD well records go back to 1992.
   Department's intention is to keep all records.



#### Collaboration with Municipalities

- We want to know going forward what type of improvements we can make in our collaborative partnerships ~ what information do you need?
- When in doubt if a permit has been issued or not, contact the health dept.
- If there isn't a permit from KCHD, please contact us and issue stop order to contractor or company.
- We confirm with local municipality and request in writing no objection to issuing closed loop well permits. Your approval matters!!
- When we give an approval do you want to know? Do you need copies of the permits? Request to accompany on a site visit?
