Focus on reducing emissions from Energy, Buildings, and Transportation sectors

EPA Updates

- 12/12 NOFO revised
 - Notice of Intent rather than MOA, MOA deadline extended to July
 - Clarified eligible agencies (wastewater reclamation, forest preserves)
- 12/18: Guidance on how to compute emissions reductions

• How can this work continue after the grant ends (2030 - 2050)?

Plan Ideas

- **Group buys** (solar, battery storage, geothermal heat pumps, cold climate air source heat pumps, electric vehicle (EV) chargers for multifamily buildings)
- **Rebates** (electric landscape and snow removal equipment, personal EV chargers)
- Conversion program (replace gas motor with electric for commercial landscape equipment)
- Education and outreach (communitywide and targeted energy efficiency and benchmarking, electrification, renewable energy, financial incentives)
- Your ideas?



Roles - Grant Application

County lead role:

- Complete and submit the application
 - Workplan (measures, milestones, timeline)
 - Compile budget
 - Calculate emissions reductions, assumptions, and cost effectiveness
 - List metrics for reporting
 - Compile Environmental Justice data
 - Gather grant past performance
- Draft a Notice of Intent and/or Memo of Agreement for State's Attorney review
- Coordination with MMC/CMAP re: PCAP
- Request letters of support from local community



Roles - Grant Application

Participant role:


- Provide detailed budget costs
- Provide measurable impacts
- Provide input on the workplan (programs, policies, staffing needs)
- Provide permitting data, if available
- Have Attorney review and Board/Council approve the Memo of Agreement
- Inform County if anything is confidential
- Request letters of support from local community




Measurable impacts for municipal projects

Please provide by 2/2

- Renewable energy how much electricity will be generated or stored annually (kilowatt-hours)
- Transportation Vehicle Miles Traveled reduced (miles); petroleum fuels decrease (gallons); electricity source for EVs (grid vs renewable)
- Buildings reduction in electricity and gas usage (kilowatt-hours avoided, therms of gas avoided)

Roles - Implementation of Award

County role:

- Contract out technical managers, community managers (as requested), and education/outreach, incentive programs
- Contract out semi-annual and final reporting
- Provide subawards for third-party projects; contract out financial management and audits

Participant role:

- Subrecipients accept subawards and follow through on projects
- Provide a workspace for community manager on-site, meeting space
- Share news and actively promote programs via your website and social media
- Participate in training and community events
- Provide metrics and upcoming schedule for semi-annual reporting to third-party

 - Manages your subaward projects
 - Gathers metrics for reporting
 - Assists in organizing, promoting, and participating in education and outreach
 - Works with Communications to share information on website and social media
 - Serves as a point of contact for staff, elected officials, residents, and businesses

- Send Notice of Intent to EPA <2/1/24
- Draft workplan Mid-January
- Draft budget Late January
- Final Memo of Agreement (MOA) Mid-February
- Final workplan Mid-March
- Final budget Early March
- Draft/Final technical appendices Early March
