Community Transportation Challenges

Whether National, Regional or Local:

- Affordability
- Funding
- Repeat Needs (e.g., dialysis, cancer treatment, adult day services)
- Cross jurisdictional travel
- Availability of transportation options/lack of options (e.g., rural)
- Access to transportation information
